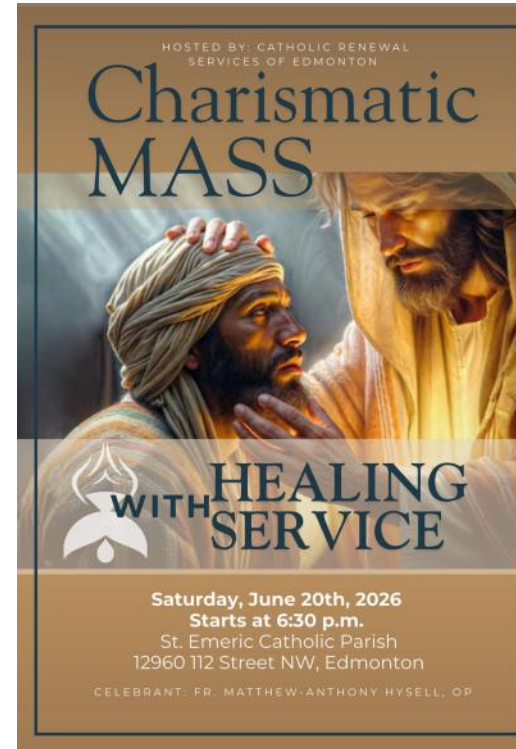

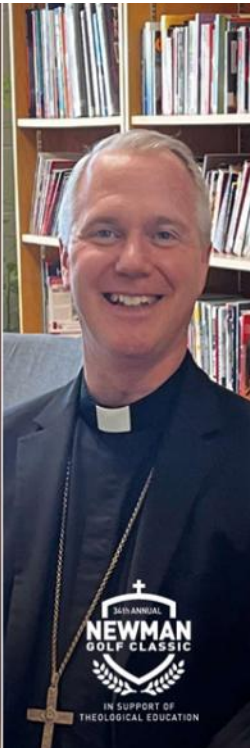

What does it mean to be a COMPASSIONATE PARISH?

That is a question with innumerable responses. There is no end to what is possible for a vibrant, compassionate parish to undertake for the health and wellbeing of her parishioners. Once again, when we refer to the term “Compassionate Parish,” this is not a ministry per se. It is a worldview, or a lens through which Our Lady of Perpetual Help embraces and facilitates ministry within our parish community. One could say that this is the culture, or an ambience, that we desire to assist in growing within our parish families.

I have often said that the time of the pandemic did not do anyone any favours. It was a time, when if there were already cracks in the unity of humanity with one another, they seemed to exacerbate and sometimes become chasms, between individuals and between communities. However, there was one positive that came out that time in our history: It reminded us that there are faithful members of our parish family who, because of age, health, or mobility challenges, could not be present at Mass. A really unfortunate part of this, of course, is that these folks who have been unable to join us in worship, are the pioneers of our parish community. They are those who built OLPH, and the ones who moved from Fir Street and the schools into this beautiful parish church.

We experienced the blessing of being able to livestream our celebrations during covid. This, because of the wonderful diligence of our AV Guru, Bob Gerow, and the dedicated AV techs who gave, and continue to give, so selflessly of their time and talent, to bring the Holy Mass into the homes of our homebound parishioners. We continue to livestream all our celebrations of the Holy Mass. We also livestream funerals, weddings, and baptisms on our private YouTube channel for folks who are unable to come in person because of mobility, distance, or health challenges. Friends and family from across Canada, and around the world, are also grateful to be able to join these celebrations from away.

I do need to say, that for the able-bodied, a livestream Mass no longer qualifies as covering your Sunday obligation to attend Mass. It did during covid, but does not anymore. We need the grace of the sacraments to be fully engaged, and in relationship with our Lord Jesus.

This brings me to the level of “Compassionate Parish.” How many of you know people, or have family members, who are homebound for whatever reason? People who have been good, faithful Catholics all their lives, but because of age, health, or mobility can no longer attend the Holy Mass. Some of these people may be your parents, or other relatives.

Several of our parish groups have been grappling with how to address this issue as a compassionate parish. Because of policies that exist for everyone’s safety, it is a requirement that home visitations by screened and vetted parish volunteers would need to happen in pairs. This of course makes sense, and even Jesus Himself sent the disciples out in pairs to places where

He himself intended to go.

With that said, if you are a family member or a friend, these policies would not apply. We presently have a significant number of parishioners who come for Sunday Mass then take Holy Communion to a homebound member of their family. Often it is an elderly parent. They simply come forward at communion time to receive the Eucharist, and they hold out an open pyx to receive our Lord to take to their family member.

We are not presently able to organize a pastoral visitor program because of the timing of the training that is required. However, if you are a family member or a friend, you could take on this opportunity to bring Jesus to someone. We will be pleased to provide some guidance on bringing Holy Communion to a loved one, and the associated prayers that would be part of it. Very simple, very prayerful, and incredibly beautiful.

My friends please do think about this and to whom you might bring the Lord. It is a great grace to receive Jesus. Imagine the grace that it is to bring our Lord to someone who would not otherwise be able to receive Him.

Again my friends, this opportunity is to assist those who are perhaps convalescing from a surgery and normally would be at Mass. It is for the elderly, the homebound; those who would be at Mass if they could, but they can’t. It is for those Catholic seniors who may have been away from the Church for whatever reason. If this is the case, one of our clergy would be pleased to have preliminary visit with them, and onward we go.

Friends, to be a compassionate parish is an attitude of caring, of empathy and solicitude. We can only ever truly be a compassionate parish when we remember and care for those of our community who are on the periphery. Communion to the homebound is a good step in beginning the transformational change into being a truly compassionate parish.
