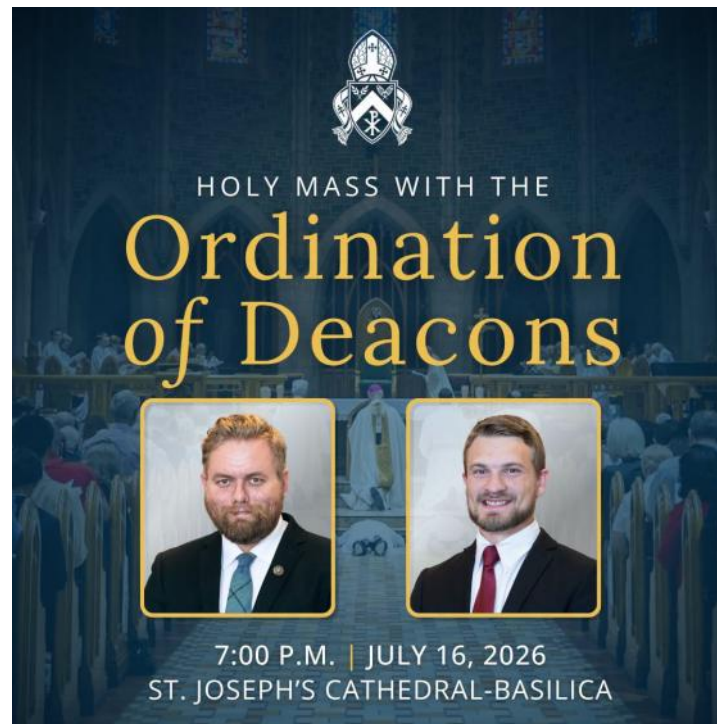

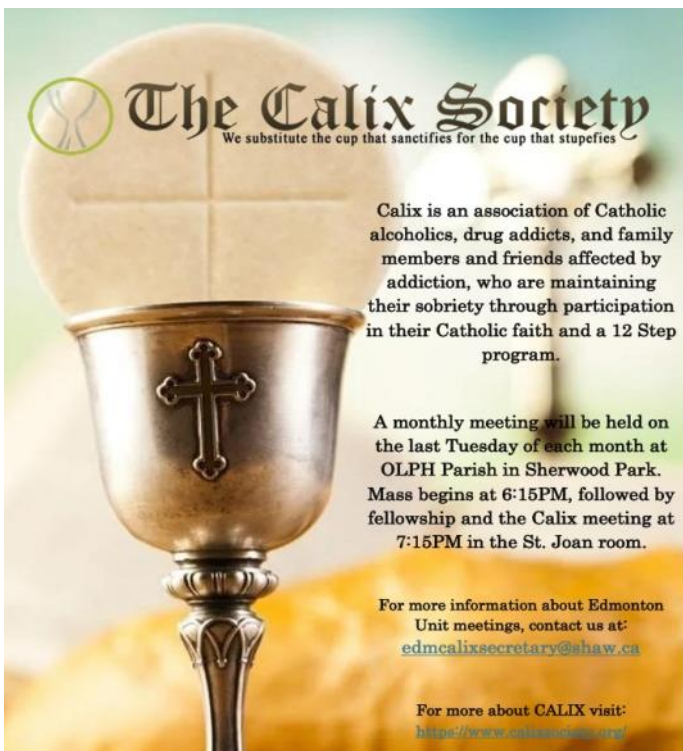

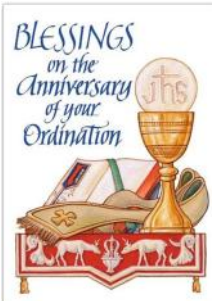

Happy Summer!!!

My friends, no matter what our situations in life - parent, child, grandparent, teacher, administrator, parish priest - we all breathe a wee sigh of relief by the time the last school day roles around! Although my last day of school memories are very much from the last century, I do remember those last days as a student. Often, we would get to watch a movie on the last day of school, which in those days was considered a treat. With advances in teaching methodology today, movies, videos, and the internet are regular daily modes of instructing our students. All this to say, the last day of school was always exciting, because of perceived new freedoms and time on one's hands to do fun things like hanging out with friends and sleeping in.

I am guessing that a considerable number of our educators and our school families have already hit the road for camping, sports, or leisure time activities. Some of our older children will be experiencing their first official summer job where they actually get paid and will have money of their own. Some of our young people will treasure the opportunity to sleep in until they wake up on their own. This is an interesting phenomenon in my view. I do remember being a teenager and being able to sleep for incredibly prolonged periods of time. Probably still growing and need the rest at that age, I suppose. But for most of my adult life, I have gotten up early in the morning. I do not know how I managed to get past the sleep till noon phase, but I am grateful. One can get a lot done between the hours of 0600 and 0800 in the morning! The only thing is you need to be up and awake to take advantage of this special gift of time. Whether in the parish or on the golf course, early morning is a wonderful time to be up and about.

For our many families who will embark on road trips this summer by air, land, or sea; I encourage you to include an interesting dimension to your travels. Plan ahead, and whether you are in Disneyland or Didsbury, figure out where the nearest Catholic Church is, and make time to attend Mass on Sunday. I offer this because that is what we did when I was young. It was not like one could google Catholic Churches in those days. The Knights of Columbus used to have a little book with all the Alberta Catholic Church Mass times in it. This was great for in-province vacations! We would vacation in Idaho when I was young, as we lived in Calgary at that time. It was part of the adventure, finding a local Church and attending. (Us kids were pretty much assured that it would be ice cream or root beers after Mass!) It was cool just to be in a different country, city, and Church and see how things were celebrated. And it was cool because no matter how different it might have been, it was always celebrated very much the same as it was at home. The Holy Mass is the Holy Mass, in Rome or in Rocky Mountain House.

The other part of this reflection of course, is that we know God is the giver of all that is good; and that we need to be grateful for the opportunities that He affords us, at home and away. The rain we have encountered may have seemed a little excessive at times; and to those who experienced flooding in your homes, our prayers and best wishes are with you. Much as most of us

feel enough is enough already, the green that surrounds us is really a beautiful expression of God's creation. I would venture to say that for our farmers, their land probably needed the water, and the present excessive ground moisture will serve them well for years to come.

My dear friends, whatever your plans this summer - Vacation Bible Camp July 6-10, ordination to the transitional Diaconate of Andrew Sheedy and Daniel Sale on July 16, Ignite Jr. summer camp July 21-23, Lac St. Anne Pilgrimage July 18-23 - know that our Lord Jesus walks with us always and everywhere. May this same loving God bless you, your families and your summer with health, happiness, and holiness. With faith, fun, and family. Amen.
