A Note on Design:

Please keep in mind that selected artwork will be formatted to fit standard greeting cards (typically 5"×7", either vertical or horizontal orientation).

Technical Format: Digital files must be high-resolution (minimum 300 DPI in JPEG or PNG format). Physical art pieces should be scanned or photographed in high resolution under clean, bright lighting.

Information Needed: With each submission, please attach your name, contact details, the intended sacrament, and a brief reflection (1–3 sentences) on how your faith or prayer inspired the piece.

**Formation for Eucharistic Worship,
Formation for Confident Witness,
Formation for Service to Marriage and Family.**

I have been reflecting on our three pastoral priorities. I am struck by how broad they are in their context, but also how they seem to fit very well with the life of our unique parish community. When I think about Formation for Confident Witness, it seems to me that this is the essential element for engaging in our other priorities; yet it is the grace we receive from the Eucharist, and our care for and the nurturing of our families, that empowers us to become confident witnesses. We live our Catholic Christianity in a practical and authentic way, which feeds our belief and our conviction in the Catholic faith we profess. This does make sense, because as Bishop Baron notes, it is the “loop of grace” that is how our Catholic Christianity functions. We recognize that we are genuinely loved by our God. In gratitude, we live our lives in the service of our families and in our community, and God continues to bless us with all things good. Not because we have earned them - we respond in gratitude - but because of his unfathomable love for us.

In the same way, I feel our pastoral priorities are an integral part of the “loop of grace.” For most of us, our families are the primary focus of our temporal lives. Hence, it makes sense that we expend our time and energy on formation and service for the good of our families. We recognize that all that is good comes from our loving God. We know this to be true, even if sometimes we may give ourselves a little more credit than we deserve. And so, we practice our faith. We receive the grace of the Holy Eucharist, sometimes every day. The grace we receive from the Eucharist allows us to become more confident in what we believe about our God; and in gratitude and confidence, we are able to be witnesses in the world and servants to our family and friends. It seems that each of these elements build on one another within us. Certainly, this will be more efficacious, the more sincere and diligent we are in entering into the process.

This past week I witnessed a very real expression of our three pastoral priorities being lived out in a practical and tangible way. Face to Face Ministries hosted a three-day summer camp here in the parish for fifty or so young people in grades 6-8, eleven to fourteen years of age. There are a couple of notable components to this type of ministry. One, it is very Catholic and at the same time it is very fun. Two, the camp is hosted and ministered by young men and women who average between twenty and twenty-five years of age. Why is this important? Because the ones who are doing the ministering are not much older than those, they are ministering to. There is a relatability factor between these two age groups.

This camp was definitively Catholic in all its components. There is no doubt that these young people were having loads of fun with a great combination of physical activities and testimonies, teaching, singing, and small group discussions. These young adult ministers helped the campers talk about questions that they may normally not even have thought about. For example: *How can I make more room for God in my life? What holds me back from being in relationship with God?* These are questions that don’t come naturally to a twelve-year-old, never mind sharing one’s thoughts in small groups with other youngsters. The testimonies and the catechesis done by the young men and women showed the young people what it is to be a confident witness. It also builds up the courage and confidence of those giving the witness.

What I thought was really inspired is that, after a big day of activity and soul-searching, each of the three days ended in the Church with adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Jesus has been the topic discussed throughout the day. How fitting to end the day in His presence. A wonderful opportunity to re-

flect on some of the topic matter of the day. On the last day we had a family Mass where the parents and siblings were invited to be present. Several campers were chosen to play more of a leadership role within the different activities throughout the days. A great mode for building future leaders and perhaps future Face to Face Team members.

Each day, responsibility for supper was accepted by active groups in our parish community (Couples for Christ, Catholic Women’s League and Knights of Columbus, and Mary’s Servants for Christ.) A great and wonderful way for all of our parish community to fulfill a key role in assisting our young people in their mission to become Confident Witnesses! And of course, the loop of grace is good for these committed Catholic men and women, who share their time and talent for the good of our young people. We really are all in this together. It does take a village to raise a child. This is just one example of the many good works and activities that are happening within our parish community. We have much to be proud of, much to be grateful for, and much ministry to do.
